
STATE EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT --The unemployment rate of the State of Indiana in November was recorded to be 4.4%, according to the Indiana Department of Workforce Development. By comparison, the national unemployment rate reported for November was 4.2%. In addition, Indiana's labor force participation rate is 63.4% compared to the national rate of 62.5%. This rate is the percentage of Hoosiers 16 and older that are either working or actively looking for work.




Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS); Captures Indiana's bloor force, which includes those currently employed and those who are unemployed and actively sweking work.
